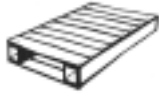


Definitions



- **Rental packaging**, for example Hayes Crates or Blue, Chep, Euro or GKN pallets are outside the scope of the Repak compliance scheme and should not be reported on the form
- Only report packaging you **own*** – It will either have your brand name on it or is applied around *your* products
- Any packaging which is removed or applied by a **third party**, on your behalf, is your responsibility and you should report it on the packaging data statistical return form.
- **Source** and **destination** of the packaging/ product are most logically indicated by VAT invoices
- **Irish Sourced / Irish market** - from within the Republic of Ireland
- **Imported** – from outside the Republic of Ireland
- **Exports** – Sale to customer outside the Republic of Ireland

The Packaging Data Statistical Return Form

Section 1



An **Input** is any packaging removed on your premises or on the premises of somebody contracted on your behalf – e.g. contract packers or 3rd party haulage companies

1.1 Irish Sourced Input Packaging – Packaging removed from ROI sourced products

1.2 Imported Input Packaging – Packaging removed from imported products

1.3 Internal Packaging Waste Management – How you deal with your packaging waste

1.3 (Top Line) = (1.1 - Reuse)+(1.2 - Reuse) less onward reuse plus QC rejects

1.3=1+2+3+4

A **QC reject**, is packaging which was purchased, but can not be applied. For example, cullet glass arising on site, packaging items with printing errors on labelling etc.

1 – RPS Scheme Recycling – This is packaging waste recycled by an approved recovery operator who receives subsidies from Repak through the RPS Scheme

2 – Non RPS Scheme Recycling – This is tonnage recycled either by a collector who does not receive a subsidy from Repak Ltd, or where the packaging is recycled by the Member themselves or where the Member exports the packaging to be recycled

3 – Recovery - This is where waste packaging is used for a non packaging function, with energy recovery

4 – Disposal - This is packaging sent directly to landfill. All Producers must ensure that all specified packaging waste does not go to landfill and is either separated at source by material type or collected for the purpose of recovery/ recycling, or transferred back to the supplier of the packaging. Specified packaging waste means glass, aluminium, steel, paper, fibreboard, wood and plastic sheeting

**with exception to contract packed products you may export*
