

## Dairies or Co-Ops – Sector Specific Example

### Important Definitions

→Section 2.1 Irish Sourced Output Packaging\_Supplied in the ROI

- Brandholder/Importer – Applies the packaging to the product
- Distributor – First to transport the packaged good
- Retailer – Sells packaging on product, which the direct customer removes



→Section 2.3 Imported Output Packaging\_Supplied in the ROI

- Converter –Imports empty packaging to apply to the product
- Brandholder/Importer – Imports packaged products for onward sale or applies ex-Irish sourced packaging to product
- Distributor – First to transport the packaged good
- Retailer – Sells packaging on product, which the direct customer removes

→Section 2.2+2.4 All Exports

- Filled Packaging – Exporting packaged products

Any goods which are contract packed, are the responsibility of the brand owner and should not be reported by the packer (this applies to both the inputs and the outputs)

**→→ NB if you sell product from another local supplier, you would only report in the Retailer section, for the packaging around the product which your customer removes** You only have to report as a Distributor for these products, if you collect from your supplier

**→→ Cut offs and process waste should not be reported on the form**

### Section 2.1

In this example, you pack milk in to paper and plastic packaging. You also sell locally purchased items in your co-op shop

- Milk is packaged in own brand packaging – Brandholder/Importer
- You deliver most of the packaged goods to other merchants – Distributor (the balance you sell at your own premises)
- The locally sourced products are delivered by your supplier, therefore you are not responsible to report as Distributor for them.
- You sell products, including some of your own branded milk in your shop to end users - Retailer

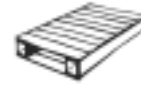

### Section 2.3

In this example, you have had to source some plastic lids for milk packaging, from outside the ROI. You also import salt licks packed in paper sacks, for sale in your shop

- Empty lids are imported – Converter
- Imported lids are applied to Product and sacks of salt licks are imported for sale – Brandholder/Importer
- Once applied, you are the first to transport most of the packaged lids on products.– Distributor. The paper sacks are collected by your customer at the shop
- Some milk (lids) and the salt licks are sold at your shops - Retailer
